FEATURED PROJECTS



Climate Adaptation Training for Students: In partnership with Innovision Consulting, this project trained high school students in 15 schools across Khulna and Bagerhat, Bangladesh's most climate-vulnerable regions, on climate change. Students developed locally led climate solutions, empowering them to lead resilience efforts within their communities.

Heritage Tales; Cultural Preservation in the CHT: With support from EMK Center and the US Embassy in Dhaka, this initiative trained indigenous university students in creative writing and cultural preservation. They collected folk tales from CHT communities, which were transformed into a visual storybook, strengthening cultural ties and preserving heritage.



Civic Manners Curriculum for Primary Schools: In collaboration with Changemakerxchange (Germany), Bamboo Builders (Singapore), and BRAC University, this project developed a civic manners curriculum for 4th graders. Designed to instill empathy and social responsibility, this pilot program represents Bangladesh's first formal effort to teach civic values in schools.



Classroom Sidewalk Game Project: This Project transformed school corridors and entrances into vibrant, interactive spaces for kids to play and learn, addressing the scarcity of outdoor areas in urban settings. This low-cost initiative fosters social interaction, peer relationships, and enhances mental growth among children through engaging outdoor activities.

Brainery: Brainery provides a four-week after-school program catering to teenagers, imparting creative skills such as comic art, creative writing, photography, filmmaking, and programming. The program aims to nurture artistic talents and foster a diverse skill set in a dynamic learning environment.



Bridges Not Borders: Bridges Not Borders is a three-week virtual after-school program empowering young adults with creative skills to navigate today's challenges and foster global connectivity.
